MEMORIAL ORGAN FUND DONATIONS: In the past few years, many people have donated monies to this fund in memory of loved ones or dear friends, in addition to those who have donated to the fund without a memorial request. It has been a bit of a challenge to identify all the names of those being memorialised, as there were so many different ways that people could donate- at funerals, at the church office, on the collection plate etc. We need your help to be sure we have indeed captured all the names that should appear on the Memorial Organ plaque, which we hope to have ready for the dedication of the organ on January 6th, 2019. If you have donated to this fund in memory of someone, please check the alphabetical list in the office, starting this Sunday, November 11th. Please check to see if a) we have the name of your loved one and b) that it is spelled correctly. This is the time to catch and errors or omissions! Thank you for your help.

ADVENT WILL SOON BE UPON US: For those interested Bishop Tom & Sarah will lead an Advent study program "*Five Gifts of Discipleship: How Do We Live Our Baptism?*" The program will take place every Wednesday following our mid-week Eucharist, beginning on November 28th.

IN ADVENT: we will participate in a number of outreach endeavours. Once again this years we invite you to share in our "Reverse Advent calendar" by adding a non-perishable food item to a box each day during Advent to go to the food bank. Also, as in past years we invite gifts of mitts, socks, underwear and personal toiletry items for SACY, and socks for Foyer Notre Dame. This year we are also adding a toque and mitt tree in our lobby. If you have personally knitted mitts and toques, or even purchased mitts & toques, please add them to the tree. These will be forwarded to a local elementary school for the use of children who attend not properly dressed.
