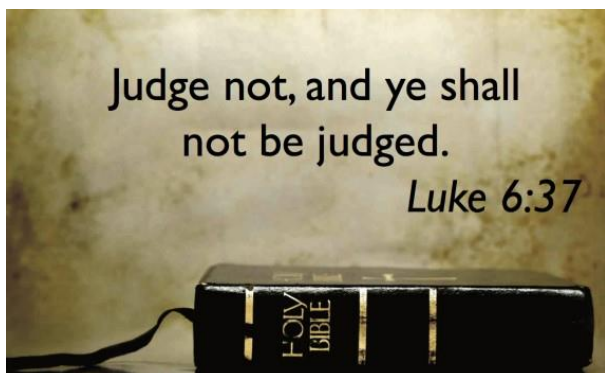

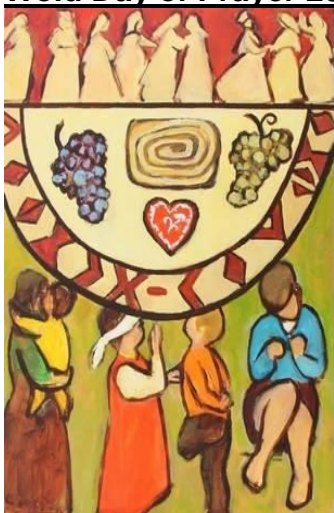

CAN YOU HELP? Parish Council has decided to split up the various tasks that have been part of the Communication Committee's mandate in the past. This will make for a very manageable workload for several people rather than one heavy load for one person. Here is a list of some of the mini-ministries we need volunteers to undertake.

- **Algoma Anglican representative:** This would involve sending a short article to the Algoma Anglican 2 or 3 times a year, perhaps with a picture or two, about some special event/service at Epiphany that others in the Diocese might be interested in reading about.
- **Bulletin Boards reviewer:** Epiphany has several public bulletin boards throughout the building. These sometimes begin to look pretty shabby and material is outdated. This person would keep an eye on the bulletin boards (at least monthly) to be sure that the information on these boards is current and appropriate, and would keep them neat and attractive.
- **Media Contact:** This person would develop (with help) a list of various local media and, when requested, would advertise special services or events taking place at Epiphany. This could all be done from a home computer/phone so would be ideal for someone with mobility issues who uses a computer.
