The Reign of Christ

THIS SUNDAY'S READINGS: Ezekiel 34:11-16; Psalm 95:1-

7a; Ephesians 1:15-23; Matthew 25:31-46

The Season After Pentecost concludes with the festival of Christ the King. In this respect, this Sunday anticipates Epiphany, which also celebrates the lordship of Christ. The dramatic vision of Christ coming to reign on his glorious throne governs all texts for today. From the Prophet Ezekiel, we hear the subtheme of Christ as shepherd separating sheep from goats. In this portion of Psalm 95, the psalmist sings praise to the glory of our Creator God. The psalmist also echoes Ezekiel; God is the shepherd and the people are the sheep. The author of Ephesians describes Christ's reign as having been established by God's "great power", put to work in the raising of Christ from the dead and portrays this reign through the image of Jesus seated at God's right hand in the heavenly places. In the Gospel story, Jesus concludes his public instruction. At this point in Matthew's gospel, Jesus not only teaches but also embodies what it means to fulfill God's commands.

Question for Reflection

How would it change you to see the face of Christ in every stranger you meet?



Health and Safety Reminders and REVISIONS

When we first reopened the church in September, we knew we were on a steep learning curve in terms of how best to care for and protect people; knowing that revisions would need to be made through trial and error.

- SOCIAL DISTANCING is something that we all need to be more mindful of on Sunday mornings. <u>In order to guard against crowds forming outside the church office, we ask that instead of arriving at 10am, that you please arrive for worship no earlier than 10:15am.</u>
- Please note that in the colder months the old front doors of the church will not be opened either before or following worship.
- At the end of each worship service, please do not exit your pew until you see that you are being led out by those serving as sides people.
- In keeping with diocesan protocols and guidelines, our congregation capacity cannot exceed 50 at any given time – that includes clergy, organist and lay readers.
- Masks must be worn at all times. Physical distancing must be observed as well
 as proper handwashing. Amber stage does not permit us to serve food and
 beverages at this time.
- Sunday morning worship will begin promptly at 10:30am. We ask that you please arrive by 10am so that we can record your name and phone number and ensure that you are seated safely.
- Although we have not yet resumed our Sunday School, children and young people are welcome and encouraged to join with their families for worship.

Children and youth are invited to sit quietly with their families in their assigned pews. It is recommended that books, crayons and colouring books be brought from home. We safely welcome all people, of all ages to worship at Church of the Epiphany.

A Note from Rev. Dr. Elizabeth Green


