WORSHIP CELEBRATION FOR THE TWENTY-FIFTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST ~ SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 19th, 2023 ~

8:30am - Traditional Said Service of Holy Communion (BCP)

10:30am - Main Worship Service with music and Holy Eucharist.

<u>READINGS FOR THE TWENTY-FOURTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST:</u> Zephaniah 1:7, 12-18; Psalm 90:1-8, 12; 1 Thessalonians 5:1-11; Matthew 25:14-30.

<u>SUMMARY OF READINGS:</u> Like Amos, from the prophet Zephaniah we hear an announcement of judgement that is directly related to the justice of God. Reminders of the transience and unpredictability of life are repeated in the communal lament that we hear in Psalm 90. In his instructions to the church, Paul teaches that the proper way to prepare for the Lord's return is not by calculating the time and place, but by conducting oneself properly and establishing meaningful relationships within the community of faith. Jesus teaches the same message in the parable of the talents, where he concedes that the end may not occur until "after a long time," but insists that the question of how one has handled one's position of trust will eventually be raised.

QUESTION(S) FOR REFLECTION: If we believe in the kingdom to come, we need not fear, in life or in death. How does that change the way we live?

A NOTE FROM REVEREND ELIZABETH

Dear Friends in Christ,

On Wednesday and Thursday of this week I attended the Executive Committee Meetings for the Diocese of Algoma. The bulk of these meetings mainly concern property and financial matters that relate to parishes and deaneries within our diocese. Archbishop Anne chairs these meetings beautifully. She always encourages us to remain hopeful throughout every discussion, however difficult it may be.

As our diocesan bishop, Archbishop Anne has her finger on the pulse of our diocese in ways that nobody else can. In her wonderful sermon that she offered to us during our morning Eucharist, Archbishop Anne touched upon the fact that every parish in our diocese is struggling in one way or another, and for many reasons. She reminded us that most of the struggles and challenges we face harken back to the Covid 19 pandemic. The reality is that not one parish has returned to the "way that it was before."

Of course, this includes the Church of the Epiphany;

however, ours is not a "bad news" story. Ours is a story of hope because we are people of hope, and with hope comes the God-given possibilities for new life. One of the ministries that has been blessed with the hope of new life at the Church of the Epiphany is our monthly "Lunch and Learn" event. Thanks to the care, commitment and dedication of our Outreach Committee, our Lunch and Learn events are occasions for all of us to break bread together and to learn more about people, issues and

challenges that affect so many of our neighbours. Thus far I have attended three Lunch and Learn sessions – all three were excellent! I encourage all of you to attend these events, and if possible, to see how you might help to support this most promising ministry that has been rekindled with the hope of new life. The same can be said for our Coffee Hour ministry of hospitality. And although the overall number of participants have dwindled, there still remains the choir and ministry of music, the chancel guild ministry, and the JOY (*just older youth*) friendship group; all these things are alive in their purpose for ministry. They combine to generate life within our church. In other words, and in case you have not noticed, there is life at the Church of the Epiphany.

There is life in our community of faith; and like all living things, every aspect of life in our church community needs to be supported, cared for and tended to, just as God in Christ supports, cares for and tends to us all through the hopeful promise of life that gives life. The more of us who engage in the life of the Church of the Epiphany, the more that life will continue to grow, to flourish, and to further become a place where the love of God is real and is made known in ways that we cannot yet imagine.

There is Life Here. I pray we all become a part of it and share in the hope that it offers to us all. Thanks be to God.
