WORSHIP CELEBRATION FOR THE THIRD SUNDAY IN LENT ~ SUNDAY, MARCH 3rd 2024 ~

8:30am – Traditional Said Service with Holy Communion (BCP)

10:30am – Main Worship Service with music and Holy Eucharist (BAS).

READINGS FOR THE THIRD SUNDAY IN LENT: Exodus 20:1-17; Psalm 19; 1 Corinthians 1:18-25; John 2:13-22

SUMMARY OF READINGS: Today's passage from the Hebrew serves as a reminder of what it means for us to be a people of the covenant. One who fails to live up to the stipulations within the

Ten Commandments has placed himself or herself outside the covenant. The 19th psalm echoes the notion that the law provides not only a general map for human living but that it also provides Godgiven directions along the highway of life. In his first letter to the ancient church in Corinth, Paul recognizes that not accepting the gospel is a subjective act. The gospel is the power of God "to us who are being saved." It is out of our own experience of the saving work of God that we are able to recognize the crucified Christ as "the power of God and the wisdom of God". The gospel story shines a light on the conflict of values; a conflict between what Jesus Christ really means and those values espoused by the structures of religion with which Jesus contended.

QUESTION FOR REFLECTION: The third Sunday in Lent focuses on the gift of God's law. John Calvin (1509-1564) described three uses for the Ten Commandments: First, they show us how to live before God and neighbour and expose our sins in failing to live as God intends. Second, they instruct our civic or common life, showing us how to live responsibly in the freedom God gives. Third, rather than show us what we must do in order to *receive* God's grace and love, the commandments show us how we should live *because* we are a people who have already received God's grace and love in Christ Jesus. Does God's law restrict or enhance our freedom as human beings?

<u>AT HOME PRAYERS - Morning</u> — God of heaven and earth, I listen this morning for the sound of your glory: in the song of the birds, in quiet conversations that begin the day, in easy laughter among friends, in sunlight's warmth, pattering rain, or silent snowfall. Give me ears to hear your glory in many forms. Give me eyes to see your glory in its many guises. Throughout this day I, too, will proclaim your glory, your grace, and your love so that I may be part of the chorus of praise that stretches to the ends of the earth. In Christ's name, I pray. Amen.

Evening - God of freedom, I thank you for claiming me as your own and for setting me in the midst of the community of faith. Today the news was filled with stories of people who do not live according to your commandments, with grievous results. Lives are shattered as your ancient tablets of stone are broken again and again. And I struggle, too, in my own ways, to live before you and my neighbours in faithfulness, generosity, and love. As the day comes to an end, I pray for forgiveness for myself and for this weary world, confident of your grace and mercy. Send your gift of Sabbath rest, and let me sleep in peace as, over and around me, night declares to night your power and glory. In Jesus' name I pray. Amen.

A NOTE FROM REV. ELIZABETH:

Why is My Plan Not Working?

Dear Friends in Christ.

Vestry Season in the life of any Anglican Faith Community is usually always stressful. One reason for that has to do with all the hard work and good care that goes in to preparing for an informative, transparent, productive and worthwhile Vestry meeting. Hard conversations need to happen, financial statements need to be prepared and explained, reports need to be written and submitted, worship

needs to be tailored to under an hour. In preparation for an annual Vestry Meeting, these things and more fall on our plates, even while the usual everyday cares and concerns of our lives persist. The other reason why Vestry Season is often stressful is because everyone wants the best for our beloved church - and that's Good! But challenges arise because everyone's idea of "what is best for our church" is weighed or measured differently. For example, we all want our church to "grow". For some, "growth" might simply mean an increase in membership, and for others, "growth" might mean growing in discipleship or growing more fully in their relationship with God in Christ. Because "growth" can be interpreted differently depending on one's point of view, debate can easily arise over which interpretation is more important in relation to "what is best for our church". Just like living in a family is not always easy, neither is living



in community. And yet as Church, we are called to be the body of Christ in our present place and for our present time. And that is precisely what distinguishes us, or sets us apart, from any other family, group, or organization. **Jesus.**

Christ Jesus who calls us to be his heart, his hands, his feet, his pattern and his *life* in the world is who sets us apart. When I look at the image alongside my note, I hear it speak a thousand words as it tells an old, and all too familiar tale. Whatever plan a community of faith may come up with, be it through certain skills, or a carefully crafted strategy, a balanced budget, or any other effort or idea that we might include in our plan for *what is best for our church*, our plan will not work if it is not grounded, rooted, tethered and upheld by the gospel.

If the life, teachings and examples of Jesus are not our starting place, then as Church, we will be aimlessly set adrift and run aground by way of our own misguidance. I know. I have seen this happen before. Therefore, as your priest and pastor, and in this season of our Vestry, I am renewing my commitment to better serve the community of the Church of the Epiphany by ensuring that we hold fast to the gospel in all that we do and in all that we are. That is, after all, what God has called me to do with everything that is in me. In this time of our annual Vestry, I vow to go, do and follow as I have been called by God in Christ through the waters of baptism. I pray you will too, so that together, we may grow in every way through our relationship with God and with each other.
