

From the Desk of our Archdeacon

A reflection on Lenten observances

The Ash Wednesday service in the Book of Alternative Services invites the participants in the liturgy to 'observe a holy Lent by self-examination, penitence, prayer, fasting and almsgiving, and by reading and meditating on the word of God' (BAS p. 282). Attempting to address all of these elements of Lent is a laudable goal but so too is focusing on one or two so that discouragement doesn't overwhelm the attempt. Fasting, for instance, can mean skipping lunch for the duration of the season, or staying away from a particular food. The purpose of this action is to develop the spiritual fruit of self-control and grow in our understanding that God is the source of our food. Almsgiving is assisted by choosing a particular organization to support and dedicating some money toward it. The Church of the Epiphany is suggesting that Alongside Hope (formerly PWRDF) become a target for alms in this congregation during this year's Lenten season. Reading and meditating on the word of God will be assisted by a number of exciting and interesting Bible studies that are listed below. You are all invited to consider how you might 'observe a holy Lent' - perhaps by choosing one or more of these activities.

You may not see them, but countless families feel your kindness.

This is another small step we can take to deal with environmental waste.
