

Archdeacon Glen Miller will be leading this group on **Wednesdays** from 11:30 – 12:30.

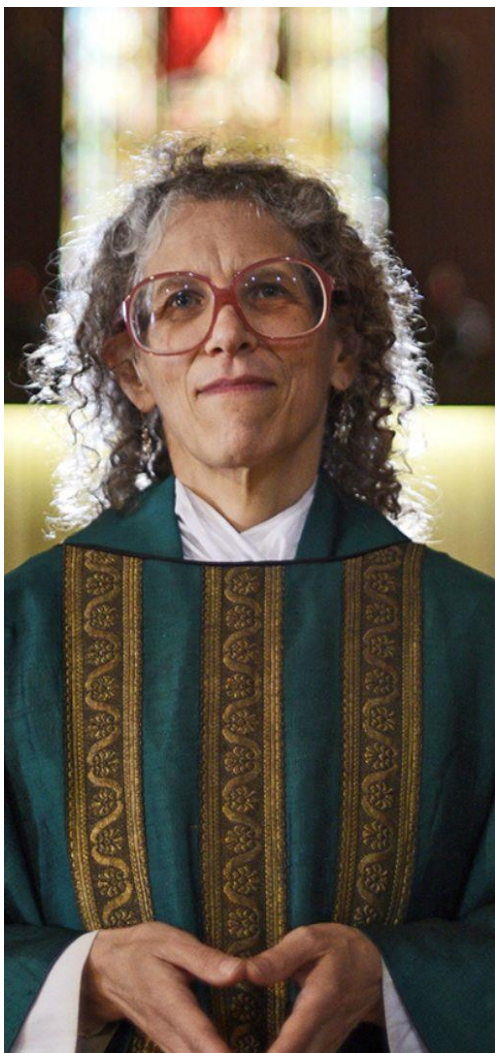

The **Elgin Street Mission** has put out a request for women's and men's mitts - waterproof if possible. You can bring them to the church by February 8 and someone will take them to the mission.

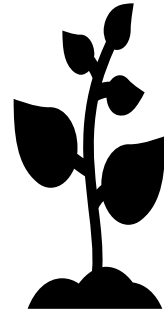


Memorial Garden
