From the Desk of our Archdeacon

A Reflection on Philippians 2:5-11

This Sunday the focus will be on two very important events in the life and ministry of Jesus. The beginning of the liturgy will feature a focus on Jesus coming into the Temple being hailed by the crowds with shouts and with prayers for God's salvation. Later in the liturgy we turn our attention to the end of that week when Jesus is crucified. The letter written by St. Paul to the Christians in Philippi - particularly the portion cited above - provide a pivot point for the two events on which the focus is placed this Sunday. Some scholars suggest that St. Paul is quoting a hymn while others think the poem was original to St. Paul but it is the content that is the true wonder regardless of its source. We are urged in this reading to: "Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness." The journey during Lent was meant to help us learn a little more about the mind that was in Jesus in order that our minds might be renewed and transformed. As we think and pray about the events marked out during Holy Week may our minds become more in line with Jesus' mind.

1. What are the important moments on which your focus rests from the story of the entrance into Jerusalem?
2. What message about your own life and relationships do you hear in these stories?
3. Are there changes in your life choices that you are being asked to make through your contemplation of these events in Jesus' life and ministry?

Since February 28, the escalating military violence in the Middle East has been worsening and widening, with humanitarian needs rising rapidly:

- More than 2,000 people have been killed, and more than 20,000 people are injured.
- Nearly 4 million people are internally displaced. In Lebanon alone, more than 810,000 people, including 290,000 children, have been forced to flee their homes.
- Hostilities have affected 14 countries so far, destroying or damaging schools, hospitals, health centres and energy infrastructure.

The Humanitarian Coalition (HC) is raising funds to rush life-saving assistance to people in need in Lebanon, Syria and across the wider region. The HC comprises 12 leading international aid organizations in Canada including the Canadian Foodgrains Bank. As a member of the Foodgrains Bank, Alongside Hope is able to participate in emergency fundraising appeals.
